BP 4100 Graduation Requirements for Degrees and Certificates

The <u>Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District</u> (District) grants the degrees of Associate in Arts and Associate in Science to those students who have completed the subject requirements for graduation and who have maintained a 2.0 average in subjects attempted. Students must also complete the general education residency and competency requirements set forth in Title 5 regulations.

The District has certificate programs that upgrade and develop occupational and vocational proficiency. Students may be awarded an appropriate certificate upon successful completion of courses of study or curriculum for which the District offers a certificate.

The Chancellor, in a manner consistent with Board Policies 2410 and 2510, shall establish procedures to determine degree and certificate requirements and to assure that graduation requirements are published in the District's Grossmont College and Cuyamaca College catalog(s), on the District website. and included in other resources that are convenient for students.
