Policies and Procedures Review (Cindy Miles)	 BP/AP Review Cycle – Chapters 1 and 2: The Chancellor announced that, in accordance with BP 2410 Board Policies and Administrative Procedures and AP 2410 Review, Preparation, and Revision of Board Policies and Administrative Procedures, Chapters 1 and 2 were selected for review in 2013. The Chancellor's Office staff have finished reviewing the designated chapters, and appropriate revisions have been or will be forwarded to DEC for review. In accordance with AP 2410, the Chancellor's Office will notify appropriate parties of the chapter to be reviewed in 2014. Revisions remain in process on BP/AP 3435 Discrimination and Harassment Investigations, 		
C.	Governance Handbook Triennial Evaluation— Discussion on how to evaluate the quality and effectiveness of the District's participatory governance process.	BP/AP 7320 Fingerprinting, and BP/AP 7270 Student Workers. Survey examples for committee evaluations were distributed to Council members to review prior to the meeting. Council members discussed an annual review by each council/committee listed in the Handbook, methods for collecting responses, and how that would feed into the 3-year evaluation. Suggestions included developing 3-4 open-ended questions; ensuring council/committee members have sufficient time to consider the questions prior to answering; ensuring input is received from each member; and allowing individual councils/committees' input as to how to collect responses from their members.		
		Action: Chris Tarman will draft an annual evaluation process for review at the next DEC meeting. Discussion next month will also include the 3-year evaluation on the governance process. DEC members were asked to think about the following question: If we are asking about the quality and effectiveness of our participatory governance process, from whom do we need feedback?		

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D. Campus Safety (Jim Mahler)	Cindy Miles introduced guests Lt. Jose Sanchez, interim chief of police, and Rick Cassar, faculty counselor at Miramar College.	
	 Lt. Sanchez provided an update on assessments of the police department and emergency response procedures; task force meetings for web communication and notification; and big-picture emergency training. 	
	 Mr. Cassar provided information on the <u>Behavioral Intervention Team</u> at Miramar College, and distributed the <u>Behavioral Reference Guide</u>, <u>BIT Referral Form</u>, <u>Community Mental Health</u> <u>Resources</u>, and <u>Help Lines</u> resource information which are linked to the website. 	
	Council members discussed safety and emergency response concerns, and the need for a comprehensive communication plan and comprehensive training plan.	
	Next steps: The Communications Team will answer critical questions while the necessary assessments continue in process. DEC members were asked to send Valeri Wilson questions to be answered in the Team's initial communication.
