Sue Rearic reviewed the docket information with council members.

Item 203—Sue said this is a place holder for Institutional Accreditations Standards in case this item moves forward to the Governing Board.

Item 302—Sue went over all the amounts for the budget revisions increases and decreases. There was discussion as to why the decrease of \$107,029 in the non-credit Student Success & Support Program (SSSP) is so much. Sue said that the decrease is due to percentage recalibration (90% decrease) of prior years. There was also discussion regarding Student Success monies.

Sue said that the docket item numbers may actually be revised, she will know soon as numbers are configured. She also said that Jennifer Fujimoto is checking with the State to see if anything can be done with the decrease.

Item 304—There was discussion on number 2 of the RATS list, G4S Secure Solutions, Inc. Rocky stated that CSEA would like this pulled from the RATS list. CSEA would like information requested and time to review before this goes forward. Sue said the item will be pulled.

Next Steps: Item 302 verbiage may change. Item 304, number 2, *G4S Secure Solutions, Inc.* will be pulled from the RATS list.
