Offerings are established and maintained in civic, vocational, literacy, health, homemaking, technical and general education, including, but not limited to, classes in the fields of music, drama, art, handicraft, science, literature, nature study, nature contacting, aquatic sports and athletics.

Offerings are established and maintained to meet the changing needs of the community and complement the credit and noncredit offerings of the colleges.

Offerings are designed to provide instruction and to contribute to the physical, mental, moral, economic, or civic development of the individuals or groups enrolled in them.

Offerings are open for the admission of adults and minors. of those minors as in the judgment of the governing board may profit.

General fund monies_ys are not expended to establish and/or maintain community service or contract education offerings. Enrollment fees for individuals and contract training fees are based on labor market research and actual costs for providing each activity or training. Students enrolled in community service offerings may be charged a fee not to exceed the cost of maintaining community service classes, or classes may be provided for remuneration by contract, or with contributions or donations of individuals or groups.
