- A. Review of February 18, 2014, Governing Board Dockets
 - 4:00 PM workshop: statewide initiatives concerning community college baccalaureate and Workforce training demands in nursing

Action/Follow-Up

Dr. Cooke reviewed the docket information with council members.

- Item 654 Facilities Bonds Semi—Annual Progress Report—Linda stated this item may not be ready to go.
- Item 302 Budget Revisions—it was noted that item 2.a.(1) would be amended to reflect that the District received a "net" decrease to Disabled Students Programs & Services.
- Item 303 Purchase Orders and Warrants—Linda Bertolucci reviewed the item and explanation of hourly and salaried costs.
- Item 401 Grossmont College Drought Tolerant Landscaping Phase II; Ratification of Award—Linda Bertolucci said this item was pulled from the January Board docket for further review of cost and scope to ensure it was cost effective for the college. The original contract was approximately \$658,000. After looking at two deductive alternates, the contract to be awarded is at a lesser cost of \$453,000.
- Item 502 Sabbatical Projects 2014-2015—Sue Gonda and Alicia Munoz went over the sabbatical leave abstracts from 8 Grossmont College and 5 Cuyamaca College faculty. There was some discussion regarding why we calculate costs if based on FTEF; cost based on adjunct back-fill rates; and number of sabbaticals taken varies each academic year.
