## AP 4227 Repeatable Courses

Reference: *Title 5 Sections 55040, 55041, 55253, and 56029* 

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The Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District (District) Chancellor shall ensure that these procedures are in compliance with Title 5 Regulations—and include the following circumstances. The following three types of courses are designated as Repeatable Courses:

- (a) Courses for which repetition is necessary to meet the major requirements of CSU or UC for completion of a bachelor's degree. The District must retain supporting documentation as a Class 3 record subject to audit that verifies that the repetition is necessary.
- (b) Intercollegiate athletics courses and conditioning courses which support the organized competitive sport.
- (c) Intercollegiate academic or vocational competition, where enrollment in the course and courses that are related in content is limited to no more than four times for semester courses. Enrollment in these courses includes any combination of withdrawals and repetitions.

The District must identify and designate Repeatable Courses in its catalog.

Students are allowed to repeat an occupational work experience course if a college only offers one course in occupational work experience in a given field and that course is not offered as a variable unit open-entry/open-exit course. Where only one occupational work experience course is offered subject to the above conditions, students may be permitted to repeat this course any number of times as long as they do not exceed the limit on the number of units of cooperative work experience set forth in Title 5 Section 55253(a).

Course repetition is allowable only under certain circumstances as described in BP/AP 4225, Course Repetition.

The Chancellor shall ensure that the District develop and implement a mechanism to allow it to properly monitor <a href="Repeatable Courses and">Repeatable Courses and</a> course repetition.
