## AP 5020 Nonresident Tuition

Reference: Education Code Sections 68130.5 and, 76140 et seq

**Title 5 Section 54045.5** 

Date Issued: July 10, 2012

The Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District (District) Chancellor shall ensure that District procedures for <u>n</u>Nonresident <u>t</u>Tuition will comply <del>with Education Code</del> standards. These procedures will be set forth in detail on the District website and in the Grossmont College catalog and the Cuyamaca College catalog with California Education Code, Section 76140, and follow the guidelines of the California Community College Budget and Accounting Manual in determining the District's full expense of education.

The Chancellor or designee shall establish procedures regarding collection, waiver and refunds of nonresident tuition as outline in AP 5015 Residence Determination.

The <u>annual</u> District procedures will include, but may not be limited to addressing the following components:

- <u>Determine Pprocessing fees</u>, if any, for international students
- A requirement that the calculation include <u>Calculating</u> the expense of education in the preceding fiscal year
- A requirement that the calculation rReflect fees in contiguous Districts
- A requirement that the calculation pProvide for students enrolled in more or less thatthan 15 units per term
- A requirement that the nNonresident tuition fee be set not later than February 1
   of each year
- 5. Exemptions, if any, due to reciprocity with bordering states
- **-** 6. Exemptions, including:
- Any students, other than nonimmigrant aliens under 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(15), who
  meet the following requirements:
- + High school attendance in California for three or more years;
- Graduation from a California high school or attainment of the equivalent thereof;
- ◆ Registration or enrollment in a course offered for any term commencing on or after January 1, 2002;
- ◆ Completion of a questionnaire form prescribed by the Chancellor verifying eligibility for this nonresident tuition exemption; and
- ◆ In the case of a student without lawful immigration status, the filing of an affidavit that the student has filed an application to legalize his/her immigration status, or will file an application as soon as he or she is eligible to do so.
- **▼** 7. Any students who meet the following requirements:
- ◆ Demonstrates financial need;

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+ Has a parent who has been deported or was permitted to depart voluntarily;

- ◆ Moved abroad as a result of that deportation or voluntary departure;
- Lived in California immediately before moving abroad;
- Attended a public or private secondary school in the state for three or more years; and
- ◆ Upon enrollment, will be in his or her first academic year as a matriculated student in California public higher education, will be living in California, and will file an affidavit with the District stating that he or she intends to establish residency in California as soon as possible.
