Tuesday, May 17, 2016, Governing Board Docket: 4:00-5:00 p.m., Joint GCCCD/GUHSD Board meeting regarding the East County Education Alliance, Cuyamaca College Student Center, Room I-207 	Item 310 Out-of-Country Travel to Cameroon, Central Africa for International Conference, May 24 to June 5, 2016—There was discussion if this item should move forward to the Board, due to a concern whether there is insurance coverage for liability while in Central Africa. The question is whether to have an off-campus request form or a leave of absence form. It is not a college-funded travel, however, there needs to be further research to see what form was signed for approval.

	Item 311 Out-of-Country Travel to Berlin, Germany for a 4-Week Language Immersion Program, June 2 to July 2, 2016—The details were explained to the council: Four students have received a scholarship from the Checkpoint Charlie Foundation. There is also a German Department fund held by the Foundation, in which funds are being requested for these students. The main issue is how to release the funds to these students. A comment given was that this is a fantastic opportunity for the students, and shouldn't be lost. After discussion, it was agreed that Nabil will change the definition of the scholarship to an award, and define it correctly, noting that it is for the German students based on the criteria used to select them for the scholarship. This is simply an award to the students, with an award letter to satisfy a legal read for the foundation to release the funds. (This item will be removed from the docket)	
B. Review Governance Structure Triennial Council/Committee Evaluation	 Chris distributed the GCCCD Council Evaluation form rather than an on-line survey. Response: The group agreed and decided to shorten the break and end on the quarter hour (2:15 p.m.), with a 15 minute break between meetings. 	• Chris mentioned that in 2013 review, there were vocalized next steps and follow-ups, and asked if this has been happening?
	Response: Cindy mentioned the meeting notes now have action items and follow-ups in red on the front page of the notes.
	Ari —For Classified Senate, currently there are three council members, one from each site. She feels they don't always get the time to meet with their groups and coordinate over the docket and DEC agenda. The main reason is because the DEC agendas come out the Friday before the DEC meeting. She asked if there is a way to get the agenda out sooner.
	Response: Cindy mentioned it would be hard to get the agenda out sooner with HR, Business Services, Purchasing & Contracts, and the Chancellor's Office all involved in docket item preparation. She also noted that the review of docket is for transparency and explanations. DEC is an advisory body to the Chancellor, so although their input is valued, action and approval is not what is required. Cindy said she would be happy to meet separately with Classified Senate about Board and DEC items if desired.
	Response: Julie mentioned that technically, there is time between DEC and the Governing Board meeting. Even though it would be after the DEC meeting, any concerns can be given to the Chancellor's Office.
