Item 12.1 Cuyamaca College Course, Certificate, and Degree Changes for 2019-2020 – Kim Dudzik reviewed the Cultural Diversity graduation requirement. This is an agreed-upon change in the degree requirements. Items 13.1-14.5 were reviewed by Sahar Abushaban. There was no discussion and no questions. Item 15.1 Sabbatical Project 2020-2021 – This is the first sabbatical project for an Administrators Association member. The Chancellor and Jessica Robinson gave a brief overview. The language should be more in layman's terms and not the legal language from the statute. It was noted that the changes in the law which brought about the revisions in this BP do not go into effect until January. It was suggested that this item be brought back to DEC in December for a second read, with the intention of placing it on the January 2020 Board docket for approval.
