A. Tuesday, October 12, 2021, Governing Board Regular Meeting Draft Docket	Below are the items which involved discussion and/or questions from the group:
	• Items 2.2 Resolution 21-022 Authorizing Teleconference Meetings – Chancellor explained AB 361, including the impact on public comment as reflected in Item 2.3. The ramifications of AB 361 for the Academic Senates and Associated Student Government were discussed. Chancellor will investigate whether other organizations in the District subject to the Brown Act will be covered under the Governing Board's declaration of emergency conditions required by AB 361.
	Item 8.1 Redistricting – The Chancellor provided background on the draft trustee area maps to be presented. Our redistricting contractor, Redistricting Partners, does not see a need to redraw GCCCD trustee area lines as GCCCD is within the 10% variance

threshold beyond which area lines must be redrawn.

B. Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (UPCCAA)	Using the attached <u>presentation</u> , Nahid Razi and Jim Bray (Gafcon) explained the transition to UPCCAA.

 <u>BP/AP</u> 6345 Bids and Contracts–UPCCAA (new) <u>UPPCCAA Resolution</u> 	 A list of qualified bidders will be maintained, which is updated annually. However, contractors may be added to that list any time throughout the year. 	
	 The UPCCAA-related Board Policies and Administrative Procedures were reviewed. 	
	 "Force account" refers to the District's in-house workforce. 	
	 In AP 6340 the \$10,000 limit reflected in the first bullet under "Bid Limits" will be raised periodically. Rather than update this AP every time the amount changes, it will include a link to a page on a state website which reflects the current bid limits. 	
	 Approvals of changes in excess of 6% of the original contract amount via informal bids cannot be approved by ratification, and must be approved in advance by the Board. AP 6345 should be updated to reflect this requirement. 	
C. IEPI Project Status Update	The Chancellor reported that the District had its final IEPI team visit last week. The IEPI team was very impressed with GCCCD's progress. The project included a comprehensive list of all software, governance processes, a curriculum management system review, and many other projects.	
	Recommendations included a greater sense of urgency regarding enrollment management and governance related to IT.	
	The Chancellor is considering applying for another grant to review Districtwide governance.	
D. Proposed Risk Management Department	 The Chancellor reported that it has become clear during COVID crisis that the District needs a Risk Management Department. A draft departmental structure was shared. Job descriptions for the Risk Management Department 	
	have not yet been formulated.
