	Cameras installed near the women's volleyball courts: These are not part of District's security system. They are for filming sporting events, and for sharing with talent scouts. Since these cameras are a college initiative, Denise will follow up on the background regarding their installation, intended uses, and who will have access to the filmed content. The Chancellor proposed not turning the cameras on until details are worked out rather than uninstalling them and then reinstalling them. Colleen, Jim and Wayne agreed. Item 11.7 Award of RFP No. B24.003 – Bookstore Operations The item on the agenda is only for permission to go out to bid and begin negotiations. The \$12,000 donation to the colleges from Barnes & Noble goes through the Foundation. Wayne questioned whether there will be opportunities for better branded gear. As currently proposed, shipping books to students would be free for orders of \$100 or more. The District is negotiating a lesser amount for free shipping. The colleges will recoup some space in the future since the bookstores will require less retail floor space.
