## About 400 people show up at adjunct recruiting event




The Human Resources Department worked with the colleges to put on an adjunct recruiting event Nov. 19 at Grossmont College to add to the pool of qualified adjunct faculty. The event was held to fill approximately 300 teaching vacancies at the colleges, and about 400 people showed up. The attendees participated in orientation sessions, engaged with department chairs, deans, faculty and staff, and were briefly interviewed. About 15 students served as welcome and tour ambassadors.

All applicants were directed to complete the district's online application process, and received a list of chairs and coordinators for follow-up.
