2014-2015 Governor's Proposed Budget

Overview:

- Governor's top priorities are education and paying down prior-year debts, including the K-14 apportionment deferrals.
- Governor indicated that he would <u>not</u> pursue an extension of the higher tax rates under Prop 30

California Community Colleges Major Highlights:

- Access/Restoration \$155.2 million to fund a 3% restoration
- COLA \$48.5 million to fund COLA of .86%
- Student Success \$200 million to support student successes programs
- <u>Deferred Maintenance and Instructional Equipment</u> \$175 million to be split between deferred maintenance and instructional equipment as a one-time funds
- <u>Deferrals</u> \$235.6 million in 14-15 plus \$356.8 million proposed as onetime funds in 13-14 to completely eliminate the deferrals
- <u>Proposition 39</u> \$39 million for energy efficiency projects
- Implementing Statewide Performance Strategies \$1.1 million and 9 new positions for the Chancellor's
 Office to develop leading indicators of student success and to monitor district's performance.
 \$2.5 million to provide local technical assistance to support implementation of effective practices
 across all districts.
