Budget update: Unrestricted Income: 15-16 Forecast and 16-17 TB Benefit rates FON (Fall 2016 draft) FTES forecast: Detail Summary 16-17 Growth 	Doug Jenson reviewed: Unrestricted General Fund income forecast for 2015-16 as of P-1, and 2016-17 Tentative Budget; projection of employee benefits rates for 2016-17; projected Fall 2016 Faculty Obligation Number (FON); FTES detail and summary forecasts for 2015-16. The summary forecast includes the Governor's January proposal of a 2% Growth (375 FTES), and a projected May Revise of 1.5% Growth (281 FTES).	 Clarification will be sent to DSP&BC members regarding the inclusion of non-tenured faculty in the FON calculation. FON numbers will be rerun in Fall. 	
	A Growth analysis for 2016-17 was reviewed that provides a recommendation that the 2% Growth for 2016-17 be allocated to Cuyamaca The college Presidents discussed plans for meeting Growth targets next year.	There was general agreement that the District would target a 2% Growth for 2016-17; and allocate all Growth to Cuyamaca.	
3. BAT Summary and Next Steps • Income Allocation Model Calculation	Chancellor Miles provided a brief history of the Budget allocation Task Force (BAT). BAT reviewed the Unrestricted General Funds allocation methodology and developed budget strategies and a proposed new Income Allocation Model (IAM). The summary outlines the improvements contained in the proposed new IAM, including components already implemented, and includes an IAM calculation that compares the 2015-16 budget formula to the proposed IAM. The proposed IAM shows a shift in funding between sites of \$47,042, which reflects the State basic allocation for small/medium colleges.	Following discussion, there was general agreement that the recommendations put forth by BAT would be adopted and we will move forward with the new Income Allocation Model beginning with the 2016-17 Tentative Budget.
