Strategic Planning update	Chris reported briefly on the 12/13/2016 joint Governing Board and DSP&BC Strategic Planning Workshop where the 2016-22 Strategic Plan was presented. The Board approved the Plan at their regular meeting on 12/13. Next steps in the process include Dashboard and web presence for Strategic Planning. He hopes to have a mock up to present at the 1/20/2017 Board retreat. Planning will also be getting underway for the 4/18/2017 joint Board and DSP&BC Strategic Planning workshop.	

2. Budget update:

Sue reported that site Business Officers met to discuss budget status updates that sites will present each month at DSP&BC meetings. The first update will be presented at the 2/13 DSP&BC meeting, and will include a summary of the first half of fiscal year 2016-17, and an update on budget preparations at each site for the upcoming fiscal year.

Chancellor Miles reported that the Governor will release his 2017-18 budget proposal on January 10. It is not anticipated that there will be much in the way of new money, but there could potentially be some one-time funds, and possibly a small COLA and Growth.

Chancellor Miles will be attending the State Legislative Conference at the end January. The priority is to ask for greater augmentation for Base funding, and to maintain support for Student Success. As part of the discussion about funding for community colleges, she reminded the Council about the lower amount of funding per student received by community colleges compared to the K-12, CSU, and UC systems:

CCs \$7,897 K-12 11,107 CSU 14,120 UC 24,788 Sue and Lorenze will attend the State Budget Workshop on 1/18 and report at the February DSP&BC meeting.

3. Nonresident Tuition Fee 2017/18

Sue reviewed the Nonresident Tuition Fee rate proposal to be presented to the Governing Board on 1/17/2017. After discussion, it was agreed that the proposal to the Board would be to establish the Nonresident rate at the Statewide average cost of \$234.

Colleges to send confirmation that the Nonresident Tuition fee for 2017-18 will be implemented for Fall 2017, and reflected in web registration and class schedules.
