Strategic Planning update	Chris Tarman reviewed the Student Success Key Performance Indicators (KPI) Report information that is available on the Institutional Effectiveness tab located on the GCCCD Research & Planning internet page. The KPI report provides the college community with useful information as it relates to students achievement and success, as well as incorporates accountability measures from the Student Success Scorecard.	The Institutional Effectiveness internet page will be updated with the latest KPI data for Fall 2016, and other data elements will be added. The 2017 Scorecard will be available on March 31 and will be incorporated on the Institutional Effectiveness page.

2. Budget update: • State	 Sue Rearic reported: She and Lorenze attended the State Budget Workshop on January 18. Although Prop 51, the statewide school bond measure passed in Nov. 2016 for general obligation bonds for construction and modernization of K-12 and community colleges facilities, only 5 projects out of 29 will be funded. The 5 projects are safety projects. The District had planned to file Final Project Proposals (FPPs) based on the passage of Prop 51; however, we now anticipate preparation of the FPPs for next year. 	
3. 2017-18 Budget Preparation Calendar - Proposed	Sue reviewed the proposed 2017-18 Budget Preparation Calendar. Sue reported that rather than separate Tentative Budget (TB) and Adoption Budget (AB) workshops with the Governing Board as have occurred in past years, the TB and AB will be presented at 4:00 p.m. on the same days as the regular Board meetings on June 20 and September 12.	The calendar will be revised to reflect date changes pointed out during review, and to reflect the TB and AB workshop dates. The revised calendar will be posted to the DSP&BC Other References page on the employee intranet.
 4. FTES, Enrollment Management: 2016-17 FTES Forecast 	Sue reviewed the 2016-17 FTES Forecast. The college Presidents discussed FTES at their colleges: • Grossmont – Spring tracking bigger than Fall 2016, but operating on assumption that summer has to be grown by 25% • Cuyamaca – On target for 2% Growth, but likely will have to port FTES back from Summer 2017.	Next, the 2016-17 forecast will be updated with Spring census info and presented at the March 13 DSP&BC meeting.
