1. Strategic Planning	 Everyone introduced themselves as this was Jessica Robinson's first meeting. Chris said the Colleges are reviewing Mission Statements to possibly revise. Districtwide, we typically have a joint DSP&BC meeting with the Board. District services will pick a date in the summer for the joint meeting (possibly June). A mid-year meeting will be scheduled to collaborate with managers (possibly March). 	

	 Mike said Grossmont College is having a Planning Forum on March 9. Brianne said the Cuyamaca College Retreat is May 11. June 19 is the date of the DSP&BC Strategic Planning 2018/2019 Plans Workshop. ACTION: Chris is going to review and see if this date still works. 	
2. Budget Update	 Sue gave updates on the proposed Governors Budget: There is a proposed change in the formula for community colleges. Conversations are happening about what the calculations will be, the funding, and the change in FTES funding. This is coming from the Governor and State Chancellor. At this point, they are looking at the Promise Grants (BOG) and Pell Grants as potential factors. District will be held harmless for one year, therefore funding will be the same this year and next year. At this point, it is hard to know how it will work out. However, if passed it will be in effect in 18/19.
