4.) Emergency Response: Below is the Proposed Quarterly Training the Sheriffs are ready to offer any group in the District; Sue Rearic is currently evaluating the proposal.

- February: Disaster Preparedness
 - State of mind
 - Personal safety and preparation for any disaster (earthquake, fire, etc.). Phone numbers and applications to have on your cell phone.
 - Home safety and preparations for any disaster. Medications and first aid kit, cash, emergency foods and water, emergency plans and reunification plans.
 Things to be aware of.
 - Vehicle safety and preparations for any disaster. Items to have, where to go, state of mind.
 - Office safety and prep for any disaster. Items to have, state of mind. District emergency plans and evacuation plans.
- May: Personal Safety
 - Surroundings awareness
 - Confidence and self defense
 - Parking issues
 - Using escorts and other resources
 - Using the 911 system and being a good witness
- August: Cyber Safety
 - o Common scams, swindles and con games
 - Protecting your identity
 - What to do if you're victimized
 - Hardening computer, cell phone and other information sources
 - Resources
 - Social medial safety

Human Resources

- November: Surviving an Active Shooter Event
 - o 7-minute video
 - o Run when you can, hide when you must, fight if confronted
 - Identifying escape routes
 - o Identifying hiding places. Know your work area.
 - o Identifying potential defensive tools
 - o It can happen anywhere, theater, supermarket, stadium, post office
- **5.) ICS Training for managers/supervisors:** Anne will follow-up with Tim Corcoran.
