C. Guided Pathways Coordination	The two campuses as well as District representation came together on Friday, January 25th for a Joint Guided Pathways meeting. Many felt the time was productively spent with there being a consensus on District-wide alignment. There was also discussion regarding next steps operationally on how to go forward particularly bringing both campuses and steering committees together. A lot of work has been done on 'meta majors' with Cuyamaca taking recommendations back to students this week.	
D. Student Conduct Handout Update	VP Robinson presented the Student Conduct Handout that had previously been through many revisions. She noted that there is a typo on page 18; should say four not seven. With Council consent, the correction will move forward to DEC for final approval.	
E. Alliance Updates	There were 733 Promise Scholars in Fall; 173 did not meet the minimum GPA. To date there are only 11 new students entering for Spring. Student Services departments at both colleges are working with potential students to complete outstanding requirements. Overall the Alliance has a lot happening in the Spring including over 20 campus visits currently scheduled, FAFSA nights, and other outreach efforts.
