B.	<ul> <li>Guided Pathways Coordination</li> <li>Debrief Joint GP Steering Committee meeting – Friday, August 16</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>A Joint Guided Pathways Steering Committee Meeting was held to debrief the forum and discuss next steps. We agreed to meet again on Friday of flex week. The following takeaways were identified as action items between now and the January 24, 2020 meeting:</li> <li>Explore and attend a demo call via zoom regarding CCCMyPath and how it will incorporate into our current systems</li> <li>Create a crosswalk of where both GC and CC are at with Guided Pathways (using the assessments submitted to CCCCO as a resource) – based on 2018-19 assessments</li> <li>Create a GP district website (with links to each college) –resource and capture all joint efforts, agenda and minutes from any districtwide events</li> <li>Participation in a San Diego/Imperial Guided Pathways Regional Road Trip to Bakersfield College, scheduled on October 18</li> <li>For the next joint meeting, possibly invite a facilitator to assist with alignment, prioritization, planning, possibly create a logic model, etc.</li> <li>Academic career pathways (ACP) (also known as metamajors) alignment districtwide</li> <li>Explore to see how ATD Holistic Student Supports can support advancing GP efforts</li> </ul>

D.	East County Education Alliance	The Alliance has a Strategic Planning Retreat scheduled on September 13 <sup>th</sup> . Steering committee members (GCCCD, GUHSD and MEUSD) revalidate vision and mission, establish 2019-2020 priorities in line with the Joint Board's priorities, and establish teams to carry out the new goals.	

E. Early Rescission of the Gainful Employment Rule	<ul> <li>Michael Copenhaver shared a joint letter addressed to VPs, Student Services, signed by him and Ray Reyes, Directors, Financial Aid. They are recommending to opt out of Gainful Employment regulations, and in doing so, not produce disclosure statements to students regarding Gainful Employment data.</li> <li>Gainful Employment disclosures will not be required July 2020, and colleges have been given the opportunity to opt out early. The work to create the disclosures is extensive and cumbersome. Ray and Michael just need to update their handbooks.</li> </ul>

The following were reviewed:</li> <li>Student and Institutional Success Council (SISC) <ul> <li>It was recommended that SESC and DCEC merge into one council.</li> <li>Membership was combined with an exception of two District employees that were removed from SESC.</li> <li>Majority of SESC and DCEC members were the same people.</li> <li>SESC and DCEC agenda items would cover the same items of interest to both councils.</li> <li>This is a collaborative council and may engage others outside the council through workgroups/taskforces.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Workforce Training Coordinating Committee (WTCC) <ul> <li>We will be reconvening this committee to support the campuses and community to address the workforce needs.</li> <li>This is a place to have discussions to meet student and employer needs.</li> <li>Member of the Council recommended that we include CTE Chair(s) to the WTCC membership, and a San Diego Workforce Partnership liaison (as additional resource personnel)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Academic Calendar Committee <ul> <li>Updated the titles of positions to membership.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
