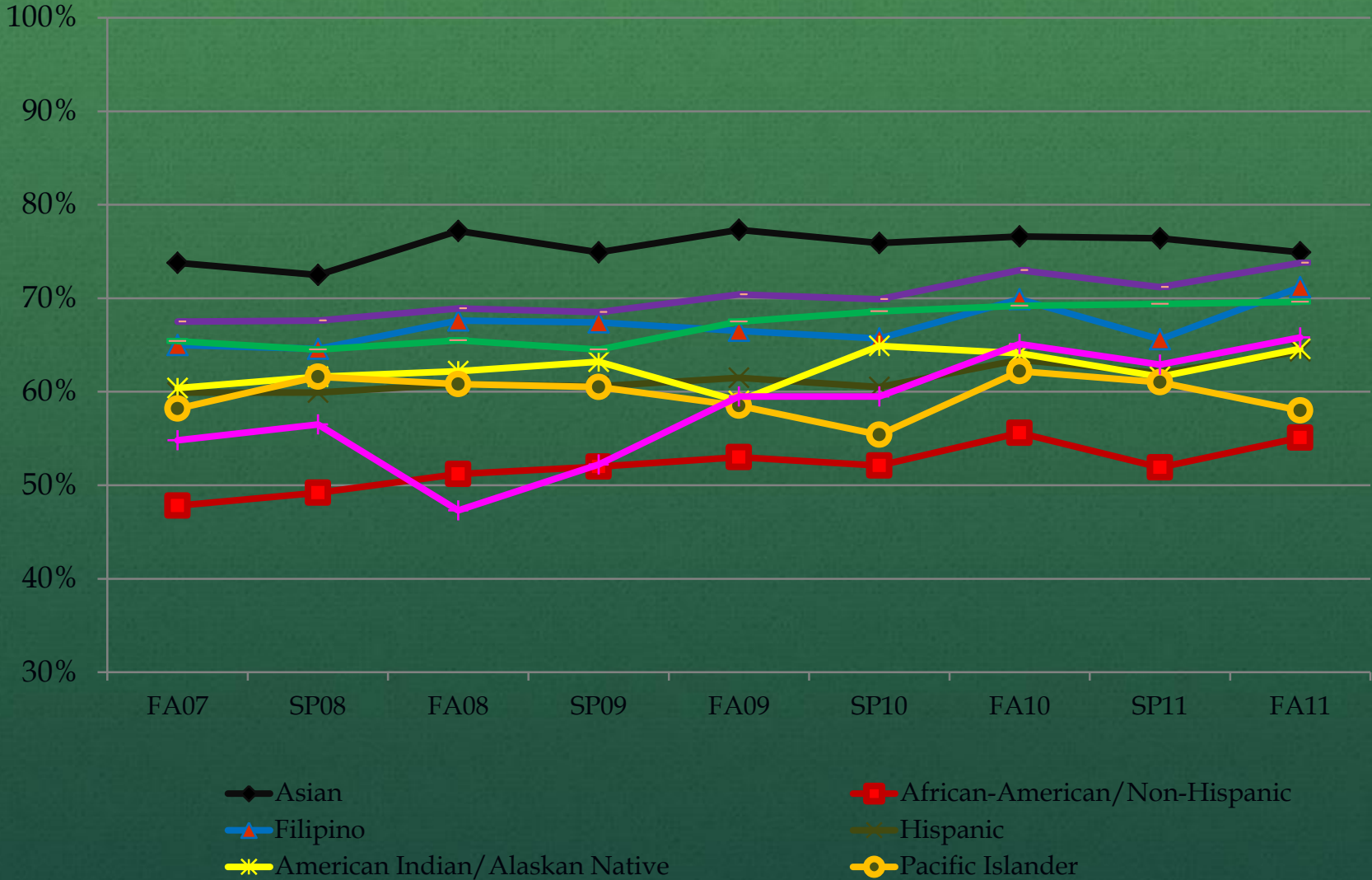
Scorecard / ARCC 2.0

- Student Progress and Achievement Rate
 - First time students tracked for six years to determine their success in degree, certificate or transfer related outcome.
- Persistence Rate
 - Degree, Cert. or transfer students who continuously enroll in three consecutive semesters.
- At Least 30 Unit Rate
 - Students who achieve at least 30 units after six years in the system.

Score Card/ARCC 2.0 (cont)

- Remedial to College Preparation Rate
 - Students who start out at levels below transfer in English, Math, and/or ESL are followed for six years to determine if they successfully complete a college-level course.
- Career Technical Education (CTE) Progress Rate
 - Students focused in a single discipline of CTE tracked over six years to determine their success in completing a degree, certificate or transfer related outcome.
- Career Development and College Preparation (CDCP) Rate - Three cohorts of CDCP “concentrator” students who complete a CDCP certificate or other degree, certificate or transfer related outcome within six years.

Community colleges now enroll roughly half of all undergraduate students in the nation.
