Compressed Calendar Exploration	<ul> <li>There is currently a lot of support from both Colleges. Resolutions approved in both Academic Senates. We would be remiss if we did not move forward.</li> <li>Listed below are several primary key recommendations.</li> <li>The Academic Calendar Committee is in favor of implementing a 16-week compressed calendar.</li> <li>The Committee is in favor of striving to make this happen for the 2023 – 2024 year. If for any reason we can't make this happen for 2023 – 2024, it's understood that we'll pursue this for 2024 – 2025.</li> <li>The Committee recommends reducing the term length from 18 weeks (1 week FLEX, 16 weeks instruction, 1 week final exams) to 17 weeks (1 week FLEX, 16 weeks instruction, no finals week). Finals are given on last day of class (or last two days of class if more time needed).</li> <li>The Committee recommends a calendar in which the fall semester starts at the same time in August as the other local colleges. We don't want to start semester earlier than other Colleges, as this could have a negative impact on enrollment.</li> <li>The Committee is in favor of not offering instruction during Thanksgiving week.</li> <li>The Committee recommends maintaining the current 4-week intersession. Having 4-week intersession lets us have first 8-week session start, and then spring break during Cesar Chavez Day.</li> <li>There will have to be thoughtful consideration to math, science, and theatre labs, but we know we</li> </ul>				

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can do this based on other Colleges and the UC System.				
Operationally it may be challenging, but we should aim for 2023-2024 as a goal. Better for students and faculty to be on a compressed calendar. It will give us more flexibility. We are also looking at moving up registration dates, and we'll have to coordinate these efforts. Recognized that it's a lot to take on for IOPS.  There is a 175-Day rule, and we need to have at least 3 hours of instruction on Saturday.  It is hard to determine the impact a College Hour might have. Also more challenging on compressed calendar.  Compressed calendar does have the potential to capture greater FTES. We would need to maximize time blocks.  Timelines for registration dates, catalog production, curriculum updates, faculty evaluations, HR processes, and class schedule updates will need to be revised. This will be a lot of work, but well worth it. Doable with right amount of will and resources.
