Emergency Communication

Information Systems, Advancement and Communications and the Human Resources Division have completed an upgrade of our employee and student records to be better prepared if needed for an emergency communication. We added 930 employee cell phone numbers for a total of 1,000 and were able to identify 18,000 student numbers as cell phones.

We especially want to acknowledge the Human Resources staff who took on significant workload to process all the changes quickly in a very tight time frame.

Quarterly Report
