Budget Update

We are currently in the process of building the 2014/2015 Tentative Budget. The Income Allocation Formula will be sent to the sites on May 13, and the Tentative Budget will be presented to the Governing Board on June 10, 2014. Our District is also an active participant in statewide budget discussions. The next step at the State will be the Governor's May Revise.

Student Services BPA

The latest *Business Process Analysis* (BPA) was held March 31 through April 2 regarding the Student Success Initiative. Many representatives from both colleges participated along with District Services in the BPA. The purpose of this BPA was to assess the current technology and processes used to support student success and develop ideal processes that will be important in planning the direction of our Student Success Initiative.

District Services Satisfaction Survey

As part of the District's on-going planning and evaluation cycle, the District Services departments conducted a survey in Fall 2013 seeking feedback from faculty and staff to help District Services departments support our commitment to serving our students, community and District colleagues.
