Fiscal Independence Update

In June, we provided a summary of the process for the District to become fiscally independent, which includes separating payroll and fiscal operations away from the oversight of the San Diego County Office of Education (SDCOE).

Our independent auditors, Christy White CPA Associates, have now completed their assessment as required to complete this process. The auditors have determined that the District is ready to move forward to the next step.

The application for independence has been filed with SDCOE and I will keep you updated on the status of the application.


Human Resources/Payroll & Finance System
