#### **Budget Update**

- The Adoption Budget, consistent with the Tentative Budget, is built on conservative estimates.
  - Assumes the State Tax Measure/Proposition 30 will not pass.
  - Includes an anticipated net reduction to the Unrestricted General Fund of \$5.6M
  - Reflects an anticipated Workload Reduction of 7.3%
  - Includes Resident FTES Goals of 15,867.
- The sites are developing their detailed budget line items 9/4/2012 Governing board Budget Workshop
- Next steps after November 6 General Election:

#### If tax measure passes:

- o Increase FTES 1,100
- Recognize income to offset cuts and provide a budget line item for potential mid-year reductions

#### If tax measure fails:

- o Decrease FTES 281
- Prepare for potential mid-year cut and plan for challenging further reductions in 2013/2014 and beyond.

#### **State Facilities Funding Submittals**

In addition to leading the team developing the Facilities Master Plan, our Senior Director of Facilities, Planning, Development/Maintenance, Dale Switzer, led the development of three new State Initial Project Proposals (IPP's). These are a component of the State 5 Year Construction Plan which will be presented to the Governing Board in September for consideration and ratification.

G – Liberal Arts Quad Replace buildings and increases the instructional capacity.	99,362 GSF	\$ 47,296M	50%

Note - Previous state funded facilities included a District match (usually 50%) to help improve the chances of successful state funding.

#### **Schedule of Cash Balances and Investments**

This schedule is provided quarterly as information on all District cash and investment balances. The bond repayment funds are included as the District is required to maintain oversight and reflect the funds on District Records; however, these are debt service funds and are not accessible to us for operations.
