## **Hazardous Materials**

For instructional areas there are two principal locations of hazardous materials: Building 30 (Chemistry and Biology) and the Photo area in Building 20. In each of these areas, relatively small quantities of hazardous materials are stored on-site. In each of these locations the classified staff have been trained and equipped with sufficient personal protection equipment to respond to any conceivable release in their respective areas.

## **Preparation and Mitigation**

- Ensure all classified staff, and willing faculty, who work with hazardous materials are trained to a sufficient level to properly handle all hazardous material, and address routine releases.
- Ensure that all material safety data sheets are easily available to employees and students.
- 3. Ensure that all hazardous materials are stored in an industry-standard manner according to all applicable laws and best practice.
- 4. Ensure that all PPE and spill containment materials are sufficiently stocked, and replaced according to manufacturing and/or statutory guidelines.

## In the Event of a Release

- All releases of hazardous materials shall be cleaned according to local policy and law. This
  usually involves diking of the spill, evacuation of un-trained/un-protected personnel (if
  required), collection of the spilled material, and proper disposal of the spilled material.
- 2. Reporting
  - a. Immediately call 911 if any release is an immediate threat to life or property.
  - b. Any release that requires the evacuation of un-protected/un-trained personnel or results in significant damage to property must be reported to an immediate supervisor. A properly trained and equipped district employee should be able to complete any clean-up and disposal.
  - c. Any release that results in an injury must be reported to the immediate supervisor, and the appropriate injury paperwork filed.
  - d. All incidental spills will be cleaned and disposed of according to laboratory policy, district policy, and statutory requirement. Spills of this nature do not require any reporting.
