<p>1. Review to the following BPs/APs a. BP & AP 3560 Smoking</p>	<p>When discussing smoking BP's and APs , Nicole informed us that she had contacted the ACLU and was not able to get any information. The ACLU requires a written statement to be sent to them from them to be able to respond.</p> <p>Since CAPS contacts students smoking and students do not comply, Student Affairs advised that they can take action if a student is a repeat offender.</p>
