First Amendment Rights Training- Guest Speaker</p>	<p>The Council greeted Deputy Williams and Deputy Bailey who offered a presentation of First Amendment Rights information and answering council member’s questions.</p> <p>Deputy Williams also gave details of a March 14th 2016 occurrence at Grossmont College and answered council members questions.</p>
<p>2. Revisit Smoking BP/AP</p>	<p>Council members revisited the</p>

	<p>possible changes that could be made to the Smoking AP 3530. It was suggested by a council member that the verbiage “smoking in privately owned vehicles” be taken out of the AP.</p> <p>It was said that if students are not able to smoke in their private vehicles, students will start smoking in private property and in fire hazard areas.</p> <p>A member commented that groups of potential students are not attending Grossmont or Cuyamaca College because smoking is not allowed. It is considered intrusive to knock on a person’s vehicle window and tell them they cannot smoke in their own vehicle.</p> <p>Nicole asked about other campuses and Elaine mentioned that all local colleges are smoke free campuses.</p> <p>Tate spoke about Academic Senate and DEC, and what their questions and suggested verbiage is on the matter.</p> <p>It was suggested by a member that smoking information be given at new student orientations and new staff/faculty member orientations. Council agreed.</p> <p>The council agreed on taking out the “smoking in privately own vehicles” verbiage out of the AP.</p> <p>Tate will take the information to Academic Senate and DEC and report back to the council next meeting.</p>

The pamphlet includes pictures of both campuses.</p> <p>The purpose of the pamphlet is to inform all that GCCCD is prepared and how faculty, staff and students can prepare for an emergency.</p> <p>The pamphlet will be given out during new student orientations and new staff/faculty member orientations, welcome week and other events.</p> <p>The council will review the pamphlet and will bring suggestions and possible revisions to the meeting next meeting.</p>
<p>4. Mental Health First Aid Training Opportunity</p>	<p>Nicole spoke to the council about a free Mental Health First Aid training that is being offered in San Diego County. Class instructors are willing to come and teach on campus as long as there are between 15-25 people signed up.
