The information will be posted on school websites, will be available to read on campus catalogs, and there will be signage posted.

A council member asked when this action took affect and Barbara stated that the effective date was January 1st 2017.

Age requirements were discussed and questions were answered by Barbara.

Barbara stated that an AP and BP must be created and once it has been approved by both campuses, the taskforce will start the process to have it approved by the Governing Board.

Council members asked if the shower facilities were going to be monitored/patrolled by someone, or if the students were going to be asked to show ID when entering the shower farcicalities. Barbara stated that patrolling the showers and asking students to show ID has not yet been discussed or looked into.

A council member suggested that there should be a sign-in sheet for students that would like to use the shower facilities. Barbara stated that it was a good idea and that she would take the suggestion to her taskforce.

A council members asked if students could use the shower located at Health Services. Barbara stated that legislation indicates that it needs to be the athletic shower facilities. A council member asked if the students will be able to use the shower facilities during sporting events. Barbara stated that students will not be able to use shower facilities during

	sporting events and that there will be a sign posted outside of the shower facilities stating that showers are closed due to college sporting events. Barbara also stated that hours of operation must be posted on the college catalogs well.
	Ideas on how to get the word out to other students that will need the shower facilities are being thought of and suggestions are welcomed. The Grossmont campus has identified several liaisons that will make sure that information is posted on the website, and the information is available to students. The office of Admissions and Records is working on a process to be able to give homeless students priority registration.
	Barbara announced that the next taskforce meeting will be on April 25 th 2017.
