



Districtwide Security Enhancements and Emergency Tower Replacement

June 2018

Overview of Proposal:

- Emergency Towers/Phones installed on the exterior campus have reached their maximum life expectancy and are no longer functioning consistently.
- Recent improvements in technology will allow us to replace and upgrade the towers at a minimal cost when compared to retrofitting or renovating current towers.
- The first phase of the project will focus on areas of customer concern and those with the most complaints- parking lots and remote exterior areas.

Costs:

- The project will require multiple quotes ranging from \$350,000 to \$400,000.
- The initial cost includes the following items:
 - Installation and all required equipment for
 - Hardware and software (cloud storage)
 - New upgraded security system which will be able to integrate with future enhancements
- On-going costs would be repairs as needed through a contract with the company of record.

Features:

- Upgraded emergency towers with consistently working features such as emergency calling.
- 24/7 on-site video monitoring with 360 degree remote views of exterior spaces.
- Cloud storage for review of footage when a crime is reported and investigation started.
- System log on may be remotely from a phone or tablet, allowing deputies and CAPS to assess situation before arrival at scene.
- Procedure in place for consistent requests from other departments for cameras.
- Proactive approach to crime prevention often deters crimes from the start.
- Other departments will not be impacted with new workloads, all services and installs will be contracted.

Potential Challenges:

- Unforeseen costs due to cabling issues during installation.
- Concern regarding camera monitoring on campus.
