<p>1. Door Lock Discussion Progress</p>	<p>Sue gave a brief overview on the draft being presented to the committee. Ken, added that after reviewing and comparing the GCCCD Door Lock Standards with those of other colleges in the area, there is no common standards set in place.</p> <p>With a high level of expertise Chris explained to the committee the difference between the two locking mechanism he recommends using for the upgrade; Electronic or a Dual Lock. Both locking machines are the best option to allow for exterior as well as interior locking of door in case of an emergency. Chris</p>
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	<p>estimates the cost to be between \$400-\$500 per door.</p> <p>Ken provided an itemized list of locking mechanisms currently in place for each and every room door at both campuses. Some of those mechanism already meet the new standards, therefore, no upgrade will be needed.</p> <p>The committee discussed a 3 year timeline, beginning in July 1, 2018.</p> <p>Sue will be discussing funding options with Chancellors Cabinet.</p>
<p>2. Camera Proposal Updates</p>	<p>Nicole presented two different quotes obtained to upgrade and add cameras to the blue ephone call boxes. Both proposals estimate the cost to be \$350K, which includes 18 new towers with 360 degree cameras. There will be 10 towers at Grossmont and 8 at Cuyamaca. The quotes also, include a 20% contingency for any unexpected cost during the installation and upgrade of the towers. She shared with the committee the pros and cons of make the update to both our campus as soon as possible.</p> <p>The committee agrees to the importance of having a better more secure campus for all students, staff and the community.</p> <p>Options for funding are still being considered.</p>
