Review of AP/BP's 3415, 3510, 3516, 3540</p>	<p>The committee reviewed all policies as requested by the Chancellors office.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3415 was reviewed with the following question sent: Can we offer training besides AB504 to staff regarding their rights and responsibilities should ICE come to campus? The concern is that many people would not know what to do
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	<p>and possibly interfere with a peace officer, causing additional arrests.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. 3510 was reviewed with very minor changes for grammar. 3. 3516 was updated to reflect the same text included in our annual security report which is a federal requirement under the Clery Act. 4. 3540 was tabled so that the Title IX workgroup may review it first. They have a planned meeting on October 18th in which a consultant was invited to assist with revisions. The council is willing to re-read the document once this step is completed.
<p>5. Panic Buttons</p>	<p>Panic button pros and cons were discussed. A summary document was submitted regarding past and current conversations about the buttons and best practices.</p> <p>The council collectively recommended that the buttons were more a hindrance than useful. There were some liability issues which arose when discussing that there was not a proper procedure in place. Nicole will send Sahar and Bill an electronic copy of the recommendation (attached) to take to Presidents Cabinet's for discussion. They will report back at the next meeting.</p>
