The Council was made aware of a page created on the intranet that houses information about the project and will be updated regularly. He highlighted that the back-end is not changing; it is really only a change to the user interface. A kick-off meeting is taking place on Friday, April 20 with the configuration consultant on-site May 15-17. IT is viewing the transition as 'no risk' since WebAdvisor is still available if needed. The Student Planning piece will start early summer with thoughtful consideration of the configurations to be carried out. Questions were raised about how the add codes will work as well as any communication plan to provide information to the students regarding the change.
